The Bob Maidment Educational Support Fund, for which we have been raising funds all summer, has its first graduate!! His name is Teng Phearom who has completed his two-year course at Don Bosco Technical School in Battambang and is now qualified in Engineering and Mechanics!! Congratulations Phearom!! This is exactly what the 'Vocational Training' part of the Education Fund was set up to provide.

Better still, as a result of his training, Phearom now has a job - coincidentally, in Svay Sisophon, the town near the Thai border where Bob and Katie [Maidment] were first introduced to Cambodia in 2007!! Bob Maidment, in whose memory the Fund was created, would be so pleased to witness Phearom's success.

SOMETIMES...A PROJECT JUST HAS TO BE DONE........

This is the remote village of Sneung, midway between Cambodia's third city of Battambang and the border town of Pailin.









There's a basic kindergarten, caretaker's house, a newly built communal hall and, 100m away, a church. Sneung has around 80 residents. There is no water here....except in the raining season when the ubiquitous 'dirty pool', similar to the one above, fills up. And of course, it's not clean.

An increasing number of children and young people either attend the kindergarten in the village or come to study English, and the community

meets on Sundays for activities. The lack of a year-round, clean water supply is an immediate and urgent problem. Sneung is a tiny village·····too small for any big NGO [non-governmental organisation] to bother with··· and so the residents continue to miss out on the most basic requirement for life.....CLEAN WATER. Clearly, Sneung needs

that water.....and it needs it NOW.

Two of our charity's basic principles have always been "those in greatest need" and "absence of any other funding". So, based on those principles.....

A new borewell will be sunk with pipes to the house, the kindergarten, the hall and the church [though Support Cambodia are not paying for the church connection]. The cost to the

charity will be \$2,000 [£1530]. Work will begin immediately, and the project will be under the direction of Father Carlos, Parish Priest of Sneung Village. This will be the charity's 15th well in Cambodia since 2016..... and possibly one of the most needed.
